- Shaina's early riding experience involved fox hunting where she rode countless hours with her family to the hounds at the Woodbrook Hunt Club in Lakewood, WA.
- Shaina began her show career at age 5 and has never looked back. Showing very successfully locally, with a promising career ahead of her, Shaina choose to train with Judy Richter in New Bedford, NY.
- As a young rider Shaina was Individual Silver Medalist in the Young Riders Championships in 1984 aboard her horse William Z. They went on to represent the US in International Competition at Spruce Meadows winning several prestigious classes.
- Shaina served as an apprentice to Olympic Medalist Norman Dello Joio during the late 1970's. In 1990 she was asked to field an entire team of 30 horses for the Pentathlon Competition of the Goodwill Games in Seattle Washington.
- Shaina has been a judge of hunters, jumpers, and hunter seat equitation since 1980. She received her large R status from the American Horse Shows Association (now the USEF) in 1988. She was the youngest large R in her discipline.
- Since marrying her husband Lance and moving to Massachusetts in 1992, her competitive career took a back seat to her role as a wife and mother to her three children. Shaina owns and operates with her family Lucky Horse Farm, a hunter jumper training facility in Granby, MA. When Shaina is not at the farm teaching and training, she travels throughout the country judging and giving clinics.
