Why should I choose Legacy Horsemanship Camp for my child?

Legacy is a USHJA (US Hunter Jumper Association) Certified Riding Academy with highly qualified, experienced instructors and well-trained, quality lesson horses. Our horsemanship camp sessions are designed for the young equestrian aspiring to develop a solid foundation in the basics of riding and gain extensive knowledge in general horsemanship,

Where is Legacy located?

Legacy's beautiful 5 acre farm is located in the Bear Creek area of Woodinville, adjacent to the Tolt Pipeline Trail. Address: 19802 NE 148th St. Woodinville, WA 98077.

What will my child learn?

Campers will be given one english/hunt seat riding lesson every day and be given hands on instruction in basic horsemanship skills such as handling, grooming, tacking up and un-tacking the horse. During the additional hours campers will receive extensive instruction in general horse care, anatomy, minor ailments, tack and equipment, feeding, safety around horses and much more.

Please note: Your child will be participating in an actual "Horsemanship Camp". Actual riding time is one riding lesson per day. There will be a maximum of 8 campers per session, grouped by age and level.

What other activities will my child participate in?

Your child will engage in equestrian games and activities designed to improve their horsemanship knowledge such as a scavenger hunt, pin the label on the parts of the horse and equine jeopardy.

What are the requirements?

- Legacy accepts campers 7 years of age and older.
- Paddock boots with a heel and an ASTM/SEI certified English riding helmet are required. Local tack stores can assist with these purchases and offer discount coupons for beginning riders.
- Included in the cost of the camp session is one pre-camp evaluation lesson.

Why the pre-camp evaluation lesson?

The pre-camp lesson included in the cost of the camp session gives the instructor the opportunity to become familiar with your child's abilities and prior horsemanship skills. The pre-camp lesson gives your child a head start on riding and gives them the opportunity to become familiar with our facility, staff and horses in an effort to maximize their summer camp experience.

Note: Lessons in addition to the evaluation lesson may be taken. Cost: \$100/lesson.

What are the days and times of the camp session?

Tuesday through Friday. 9:30 AM – 3:00 PM.

What is the cost?

\$900 per session. Includes one pre-camp evaluation lesson.

A non-refundable deposit of \$100 is required to process enrollment prior to May 31st.

The balance of \$800 is due on May 31st. Full payment of \$900 is due if enrolling after May 31st.

How do I go about enrolling my child in the Legacy camp program?

Is it possible for my child to ride year round?

Our USHJA Certified Riding Academy operates year round. Cost: \$100/lesson, sold in monthly packages. Legacy also offers riding lessons for teens and adults. Riders are required to take lessons twice a week.

Can my child participate in horse shows?

Legacy hosts on-site horse shows for students of all levels. Classes range from beginner walk-trot to advanced courses over jumps. A qualified judge, announcer and show staff create an authentic horse show experience. Riding academy students also have the opportunity to compete at local horse shows held off-site. The Legacy Training Program offers the opportunity to compete at rated horse shows throughout the US.

Legacy was founded in 1984 by Shelly Kerron, a third generation equestrian. As owner and head trainer, Shelly oversees all aspects of Legacy's operation and riding programs.
